Community Service

2019 Recap: What a year! Not our typical quilt donation year, but it was still a success for our Community Service efforts! Due to the specifications of the grant we received, our efforts were focused on the weighted and fidget blankets this year. We were able to make and donate 55 weighted blankets and 68 weighted lap pads that totaled 780 pounds!! We were also able to construct and donate 100 fidget blankets for patients with Alzheimer's and Dementia in the Minot community. These were donated to The Wellington, Mapleview Memory Care, Edgewood Vista, Unsong Assisted Living, Visiting Angels, Trinity Homes and Minot Health & Rehab. Our guild members donated over 712 hours of their time to make this possible!!! This month we donated the last of the finished quilts for the year with 9 going to the YWCA and 1 going to the Men's Winter Refuge. Although our efforts were focused elsewhere, we were still able to donate 63 quilts this year worth \$27,682.68. We would call that a success, and it wouldn't have been possible without all of your help! Thank you!! ~Britni & Luanne




Pet Beds

Some of you must have had a very productive quilting year generating lots of scraps, because you filled 158 pet beds this year! Beds were donated to Souris Valley Animal Shelter, Hairball Haven & For Belle's Sake Rescue and were assigned a total value of \$4,490.78. That's \$4500 that those organizations could spend on more important aspects of animal care. And 158 animals that had somewhere soft to sleep while waiting to find loving homes. I'm sure they will miss our contributions! As no one has

2020 Library Display

The Guild will provide the display for the Minot Public Library February 2020. We will be hanging quilts and small quilt items (wall hanging, placemats, etc.) on Saturday, February 1st at 10:30. If you would like to have one or more of your items displayed, please bring it to the January Guild Meeting or the library on Feb 1st. I will have labels to both identify your item(s) and to make sure they get back to you. The front label has the name of the quilt or quilt item, the name of the piecer, the name of the quilter, and the pattern source. This front label is optional in case you do not want your information displayed. The back label will have your name and phone number and is mandatory so I can get your treasure back to the right home. I will make sure your information on the back label is pinned in a place that strangers cannot see it while on display. Quilts will come down on Saturday, Feb 29th at 10:30 and can be picked up then or I will bring the remaining items to the March Quilt Guild meeting. AccuQuilt - Heart of my Heart Quilt



You know how hard it can be to make a perfect heart shape, but they make such fun quilting projects! The AccuQuilt Heart die lets you cut three sizes of hears quickly and perfectly every single time. Now you can make this pretty heart quilt (and more) just in time for Valentine's Day. This project finishes out at 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and uses the GO! Heart (#55029), Strip Cutter 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (#55024) and Strip Cutter 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (#55017).

Minot Prairie Quilt Guild Vincent United Methodist Church December 5, 2019

Prior to the Christmas potluck, President Jacque' Younger announced that all raffle tickets need to be turned in immediately to prepare for the drawing. Carolyn Rousey encouraged members to pick up 3 beans for the Viewer's Choice voting of completed Milky Way BOM quilts. Susan Melgaard requested that Jacque' come forward for the presentation of the President's quilt top for her year of service. A picture of the 2019 Board was taken in front of the raffle quilt. The potluck was served shortly after 6:00 pm.

The meeting was officially called to order at 6:30 pm by Vice President Susan Melgaard. There were 76 members present. One guest who became a 2020 member is Debra Sanderson. One quest was Wenona Nielsen. Welcome! **Secretary Minutes:** Flint Forsberg moved to accept the November 7 Guild minutes as printed in the newsletter. Janice Talley seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:Lynn Heald had no report.Name Tag Winner:This month's winner was Joan Mahoney.Quilting Dilemmas:None

2019 Raffle Quilt Drawing: Sheilla Anderson & Joan Mahoney were in charge of preparing ticket stubs for the drawing. 3200 tickets were sold this year. After drawing 10 tickets from the large bag, one person's name was drawn as the winner: Joe McCusker of Fargo, ND. Flint Forsberg had sold the ticket.

Community Service: Britni Kraft is collecting all fidget blankets tonight or no later than Tuesday next week. **There are 155 memory beds in the Minot area, and 98 fidget blankets will be given. From the St. Joseph's Community Health Foundation grant monies received, \$4500 and 700 person hours were used on the two projects of weighted blankets and fidget blankets. The grant was \$4000 but an additional fundraiser was enough to cover the rest of the cost. ** A person is needed to record the sizes of pet beds and where donated. There are a lot of cases sewn up. Becky Spies is willing to deliver them until the cases are gone. **There is a shoe-box size container full of ribbons that needs to find its owner. **Also, a bag of pre-cut batting scraps of 4-5" squares were left in the storage room. Community Service doesn't have a need for them.

Education/Program: **Travel Challenge—No new fabrics were brought. **UFOs: Kitty Torkelson & Shelly Eide showed a project each. The prize for the most UFOs finished in 2019 went to Luanne Duchsherer. **Brown Bag Exchange: Nancy Fry called off member's names to get their original brown bag. Fourteen members showed their finished items. **Game: Quilt Block Pictionary was played. Those drawing and guessing all 32 blocks received prizes as well as the 2nd table with 28 blocks guessed.

Saturday Sewing: The next Saturday Sewing is January 25 with Linda Glueckert teaching "Machine Quilting with Your Walking Foot." Sign-ups were taken, and the class fee of \$25 is due at the January Guild meeting.

February Library Display: Katrina Schoelberl stated that set-up will be 10:30 am on Saturday, February 1. She encouraged members to bring small quilts or other items to the January Guild meeting if they are not able to bring to set-up.

2020 Festival: Chelce Detert announced that members can pick up their Festival catalog tonight. Members can register for classes January 2 and sign-up for one-hour volunteer spots at that time. There is an urgent need for a member to help chair the Flea Market by learning how to take credit card payments and help with set-up and take-down, if possible. Carolyn Rousey will need to be doing Co-Chair responsibilities at various times.

BOM: 17 members turned in their completed BOM quilts. Each of the winners of the Viewer's Choice received cash in the following amounts: 1st place—Sharleen Larson, \$75; 2nd place—Carolyn Rousey, \$50; and 3rd place—Carol Kraft, \$25. **Carolyn Rousey handed out patterns for the 1st 2020 BOM due January 2. There are many options for the ornament block for the Christmas-themed 2020 quilt. There is no cost, and members can start at any time during the year.

Hospitality: Sue Brown announced that four more people are needed for January refreshments. She got the volunteers. **Library:** Debby Brothers showed the Fall/Winter BLOCK book by Missouri Star Quilt Co. available for check out. **Membership:** Ramanda Nash announced that members who have not picked up their 2020 member cards should stop by the table.
