

Quilts of Valor

February Education will feature a presentation on the Quilts of Valor program. There are currently four or five veterans in the Minot area requesting a quilt, and the guild would like to explore the possibility of guild members participating in Quilts of Valor.

Brown Bag Challenge 2020 Guidelines

What is your favorite color? We are playing with COLOR VALUE this year. Search out 4 fat quarters of that color for your brown bag. For instance, if you want to choose white-to-black for this challenge, you would pick up white, light gray, dark gray, and black FQs. Teal? A pastel teal FQ that is barely off white, working up to a deep, intense teal. Red? The palest pink to a deep cranberry... Yum!



Your FQs do not need to be solids, but they can be. If you like to use prints, there are frequently little touches of other colors in there. That's great! Just be sure that the FQ "reads" as your chosen color and value.

Brown bags will be available at the February meeting. Place your 4 fat quarters in the brown bag. Remember, do not put your name on the bag! We will exchange bags at the MARCH meeting.

You may make anything quilted from these fat quarters, but you must use some of each fabric. You may add as much or as little extra fabric from your stash to complete your project as you like. But your added fabric CANNOT be from the SAME color way! Add some fabric that will either add some pop, complement, or tone those FQs down.

Again, the finished size of your project should reflect the full yard of fabric that you will be working on. You could make place mats, a table runner, a tote bag, a pillow, an apron, etc, but there must be QUILTING somewhere on your project.

As much as we all love the December Christmas parties, they have been becoming a little too long and busy. Therefore, we will trade our project bags back at the NOVEMBER meeting. BE CREATIVE!

Community Service

Great news quilters! We've been awarded a \$3,000 grant from the St Joseph's Community Health Foundation to be used in 2020 for the materials and tools required to make and donate quilts to local organizations such as nursing homes, hospice patients, Salvation Army, Hope Clinic, Men's Winter Shelter, and many others. Our goal is 100 quilts in 2020!

During the January meeting, I shared a little bit about Quilts of Valor. The mission of the Quilts of Valor Foundation is to cover service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor. Rhonda Albrecht, the ND Quilts of Valor coordinator, will be a guest speaker at the February guild meeting and will provide information about QOV in ND as well as opportunities for MPQG to participate. Individuals are always welcome to make quilts to donate to QOV and MPQG is still determining the appropriate level of participation for our organization as a whole. Procedures for making Quilts of Valor will be available during the February guild meeting, and can also be found on the Quilts of Valor website at www.qovf.org.

Please join us for February Saturday Sewing! We will be meeting at the Minot Public Library South meeting room on Feb 22 from 10:30-4:30 for a fun day of Community Service sewing string quilts. This is a very easy block to make and you'll have an opportunity to socialize with your fellow quilters while creating string blocks! Bring your machine and an extension cord. Fabric, thread, iron and ironing board will be available. Come for a couple of hours or stay all day! A small refrigerator is available but no microwave. Fortunately Jimmy Johns delivers! Community Service kits will also be available to take home.

Block of the Month


Due for February: one of the star blocks or the Christmas tree AND 2 of the off center flying geese.

Die includes seam allowances, dog-eared corners and screen printed letters on die for easy and accurate piecing. The GO! Big Crazy Quilt die makes a 10" finished quilt block. GO! Crazy with colors and patterns and make quick work of whittling your fabric stash by making the GO! Let's Go Crazy Quilt – 10" Finished Block on Board die with the Guild's GO! Fabric cutter.

AccuQuilt Dies recently added to the Guild's inventory include: 55861 – Big Crazy Quilt 10" finished; 55367 – Train; 55042 – Funky Flowers Die; 55446 – Flower Die; 55063 – Half Square Triangle 2" Finished Square (Multiples); 55490 – Cleopatra's Fan 12" finished. I will make sure your information on the back label is pinned in a place that strangers cannot see it while on display. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm. There were 59 members present. Welcome to 2 guests: Amanda Hauser and Terry Hillman. Cheryl Opp became a member for 2020.

Secretary Minutes: Flint Forsberg moved to accept the December 5 Guild minutes as printed in the newsletter. Jacque' Younger seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Lynn Heald reported on the treasury. The report is accepted pending the annual audit. The 2019 books will be audited January 10.

Name Tag Winner: This month's winner was Kayleen Reddig.

Server Winner: Kim Block won the \$10 certificate for the 2020 Festival.

Correspondence: Thank you notes were received from Edgewood Vista, PATH, Trinity Health & Dakota Hope Clinic. Two door prizes from Edgewood Vista (a free meal & beverages for 2) went to Sandy Duchscherer and Gerry Burns.

Quilting Dilemmas: None

Honorary Member Nominations: Forms are available at the member desk. Nominations are due at the January Board meeting.

2020 Raffle Quilt: Flint Forsberg stated that the new raffle quilt will be ready for the February meeting. Jennifer Feller will have tickets to distribute in February.

AccuQuilt: Lynn Heald showed some new dies: heart, 10" crazy quilt, flowers, train, cleopatra, and 2" finished squares.

Community Service: Kay Barrish gave a report of 2019 accomplishments: 55 weighted blankets, 68 weighted lap pads and 100 fidget blankets were made; 63 quilts were finished with the last 9 going to the YWCA and one to the Men's Winter Refuge. The value of the 63 quilts were \$27,682.68. 158 pet beds were completed with a value of \$4500. **Kits are available and there'll be more with borders and backings at the February meeting. Strip quilting will be done during the Saturday Sewing time February 22. **Becky Spies is willing to take pet beds for donations while empty cases are available. Debby Brothers volunteered to do the recording of pet bed information.

Going Green & Elections: Becky Spies encouraged members to Go Green by bringing their own cup & plate, silverware, and napkins. The less we spend on paper products, the more money we have for other things. Becky also stated "It's never too early to campaign," for offices for 2021. Let her know if you're interested in an office.

February Library Display: Katrina Schoelberl stated that set-up will be 10:30 am on Saturday, February 1 and take-down is Saturday, February 29. Please bring items for display including small items and books.

Education/Program: **Travel Challenge—Sheilla Anderson had 3 pieces from Bernina Plus, Good Vibrations & 4 Seasons of Yankton, SD.

Saturday Sewing: Jacque' Younger announced that the next Saturday Sewing January 25 with Linda Glueckert teaching "Machine Quilting with Your Walking Foot" is full.

2020 Festival: Chelce Detert stated that Guild members can register tonight with the public registering January 15 or later. Volunteers are needed—see Michelle Senger. Quilt Show registrations go to Judi Green. Class samples were shown and on display. Note: the banquet will be starting at 6:30 pm.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by President Susan Melgaard.

Secretary: Sue moved to accept the minutes of the November 21 Board meeting with the correction of 100 fidget blankets made. Motion carried. Janet distributed the revised Membership and President job descriptions.

Treasurer: Lynn gave the checking account balance. The Treasurer's report was accepted pending audit. The 2019 books were audited by Sharleen Larson & Linda Glueckert on January 10. The three recommendations will be recorded in future minutes.

Raffle Quilt Tickets: Jennifer has ticket booklets for members to pick up.

Raffle Quilt 2020: Flint Forsberg confirmed via phone that no one has volunteered to put the binding on the 2020 quilt.

Block of the Month: Carolyn reported blocks are being turned in.

Community Service: Kay announced that the Guild will be receiving \$3000 from St. Joseph's Community Health Foundation in April. The grant goes towards regular community service supplies for quilts going to non-profit organizations. There are a lot of quilts that need to go from orphan blocks to finished. These will be organized and available. Rhonda Albrecht with Quilts of Valor will speak at the February Guild meeting about the program.

Education: Jacqué stated that Linda Glueckert's class on "Quilting with a Walking Foot", January 25, is full. Supply lists were available at the January Guild meeting.

Festival: Chelce reported that registration was open for the general public on January 15. Currently, the registration numbers are ahead of other years.

Historian: Luanne reported that the 2019 Yearbook has been sent to be printed.

Hospitality: Sue gave the 2019 report with the following items: announcing that everyone should serve at least once helped monthly sign-ups; Increase number of servers to 7 per month; Each server was to bring enough for 10-12 people. The average attendance was 56 with 75 members as a high.; Servers were to be present during serving, pouring drinks, etc. and to eat last.

Library: Debby had no report. Susan asked if she could set books out on tables during meetings to encourage members to check them out.

Membership: No report.

Newsletter: Articles are due to Jana by Friday, January 24.

Publicity: No report.

Website: No report



NEW BUSINESS: **2020 Budget—Lynn will make changes suggested and email another budget so a final vote can be taken February 20. **The Board decided to leave the rental agreement as it is for the AccuQuilt whether or not the member wants the dies only or the cutter and dies. **Two Honorary Member nominations were received. Voting will take place at the February Board meeting. **There will be a class Sunday, September 20 with Karen McTavish. Susan appointed the Education committee as organizers of the class. **The 2021 raffle quilt pattern will be chosen by the Guild. It was suggested that the timeline of piecing and quilting each year's raffle quilt be changed. The 2022 raffle quilt may be started this year, also.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:27 pm.
