




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Welcome Quilting Friends to RED, WHITE, and BOOM

REGISTRATION & FEE INFORMATION

Fees for classes are listed with the class descriptions and on the class registration form. If there is a kit fee or pattern fee, for a class this will be collected by your teacher assistant or instructor during class. There is a \$18.00 non-refundable registration fee. Your registration fee must accompany your registration form. Only one registrant per form please. If you register more than one person per form, we will have to return your form; which could delay your registration. Registrations will only be accepted by mail or email if paying by credit card. *Please pay special attention to our registration deadlines*. All fees for NSF, stop payments, etc., will be assessed to registrant. Only the registrant can attend classes, lectures or meals.

As our way of saying **THANK YOU** for registering, we offer a festival souvenir gift, complimentary "Tea Room," a Bonanza Basket ticket for every class, lecture, or trunk show you attend, and entrance into the Prairie Quilt Show and Vendors.

DO NOT send in your registration before January 15, 2024. Registrations postmarked prior to this date will be returned. **Meal reservations and payments MUST BE RECEIVED BY MARCH 21, 2024.** No meals or banquet tickets will be sold after this date.

Classes and lectures will be filled on a first come basis. Registrations will be accepted until the start of Festival. Class size is limited, so please list your class choices in order of preference (i.e., 1st, 2nd, etc.) per day and per time slot. Please pay for your 1st choices only. If your class choices are not available, your class fees will be refunded. Register early for best choice of classes!!

Make checks payable to Minot Prairie Quilt Guild in US funds only. We are accepting credit card payments for classes, registration, and meals ONLY. If you choose to register for your classes by a credit card a 3.0% processing fee will be added to your total. If you are entering a quilt in the quilt show, please send a separate check for your entry fee. Credit card payments will not be accepted for quilt show entry. See Quilt Show Entry Guidelines for further information.

BASIC SUPPLY LIST

Registrants will receive a specific list of the supplies you will need to provide for each of your classes with your confirmation letter.

Listed below are some additional supplies you may want to bring so you are well prepared for classes.

SEWING KIT: Includes such things as needles, pins, thimbles, matching and/or neutral color threads, fabric scissors, paper scissors, seam ripper, pencils or other marking tools, tape measure, etc. Choose things which you use in your basic sewing.

SEWING MACHINE: Must be in good working order. Include extra (filled) bobbins, extra needles, owner's manual, accessory box and extension cord. Be sure to check class supply list for any special accessories required.

ROTARY EQUIPMENT: Includes the rotary cutter (extra blades), a cutting mat and various cutting rulers. Be sure to include any ruler which may be specified in the class supply list. Please be considerate of the mat size you bring to class and limit the size to 18 x 24 inches.

ADDITIONAL LIGHT: Direct lighting, such as a small battery operated light.

No outside Irons will be permitted. All Irons will be supplied by the Minot Prairie Quilt Festival.

QUILT MAKING SKILL LEVELS

These are basic definitions of quilting skills and are not meant to be hard and fast rules. They are merely guidelines intended to help you decide if a class fits your current quilting level. We offer lectures for anyone interested in quilts and/or quilt making.

Beginner: You know how to use a rotary cutter, mat and ruler and can sew an accurate 1/4" seam. You've cut and sewn a simple pieced pattern with some accuracy.

Confident Beginner: You have completed a few quilt projects and are ready to expand your skills further. You find taking classes really helpful for learning new techniques and tips.

Intermediate: You've been quilting for several years and are ready to try more challenging patterns and designs. You're successful with piecing accurately and understand the finer points of cutting, pressing and sewing.

Advanced: You've mastered all the basics and are looking for more complex techniques to enhance your work. Designing combination blocks, using appropriate value and intensity in colors, movement, added textures and intricate quilting are skills you're perfecting.

Longarm: You own, have access to, or rent a Longarm or Midarm Quilting machine. You have operated and understand a movable quilting machine to layer and stitch pieced quilt tops. You are looking to further your knowledge and skill for personal or professional use.

MEALS

Meal prices are also listed on the registration form. These prices include tax and gratuity. Vegetarian or gluten free meals are available when requested on registration form only. 2024 FEATURED QUILTER



Linda Glueckert

Linda's mother taught her and her six sisters to sew from an early age. Sewing was her hobby, and she passed on this love to her daughters. Linda has many happy memories of sewing garments with her mother and sisters.

Linda made her first quilt at eighteen. She needed a quilt for her college dorm, so she decided to make it. Linda thought Tumbling Blocks was a very pretty pattern, and dived right in to it. As you can imagine, none of the points matched. She fixed this little problem by tying the quilt with yarn right at the points of the blocks. Problem solved! Linda fell in love with the "sport" of quilting and has been partaking ever since.

Linda has made wall hanging quilts for each of her fifteen brothers and sisters. These were all hand quilted. With small children around, she finished about one a year.

When she heard about quilting using your sewing machine she was very intrigued. After taking a class from Harriet Hargrave, this became her new favorite way to quilt.

Another rock star in Linda's quilt world was Ricky Tims. He introduced her to new techniques and gave her permission to try new things. You don't always have to follow the "rules."

She enjoys learning new techniques, and finds it fun to use the things she has learned in new projects. Since learning how to dye fabric, Linda has enjoyed designing new projects to use her beautiful dyed fabrics.

Linda has been teaching quilting classes at the Minot Quilt Festival since 2016. Her and husband Pete, have made their home in Minot for 40 years. They have four grown children and seven grandchildren.

NATIONAL INSTRUCTORS



Andrew Lee
Combat Quilter

Andrew is a relative newcomer to quilting; with just over six years of quilting. It all started with a comment from his wife that "they didn't do enough together." After taking a quilted table runner class, joining a men's quilting group, and realizing the therapeutic relief quilting provided; quilting turned his world upside down, in a good way. He continues to enjoy time in the studio with his wife Kristy and dog Winston creating many wonderful projects together.

As a 21-year combat veteran, quilting has become the only coping mechanism that actually works. He has made over 500 Quilts of Valor, long armed over 1100 customer quilts, and continues to find ways to help others. As a certified Army instructor, his attention to detail, and hunger to learn, allows him to be an effective instructor. He has been featured in 23 magazines, has a pattern in the newest Quilts of Valor book, and is currently working on another masterpiece in his pixelated series. His website, combatquilter.com includes many more details of his journey, patterns, and pictures of the many quilts he has completed.



Mark Darrell
The Quilting Marine

After spending 20 years in the Marine Corps and facing a lot of traumas, Mark struggled with the memories that were left behind. Mark would try to find extreme activities to help him deal with those atrocities. You name it, he has done it. None of those activities helped him to escape.

When Mark found out he was about to be a grandfather, he wanted to give his grandson something that was unique and different. It was on a trip to a local pawn shop that started this journey of quilting. Mark found a Singer sewing machine for a couple of dollars and decided to build his grandson a quilt. Little did he know that this gesture would take him on an unimaginable journey.

Mark fell in love with building quilts. The details of cutting, piecing, sewing, building, and quilting helped him to focus on something other than the trauma. It is the piecing for him. Crumb blocks are his favorite because of how random you can be with piecing without following any rules in the piecing of the quilt top. When the thoughts get to be too much, Mark goes into his quilt room and gets lost for hours. Quilting has helped Mark with his PTSD which is why he shares his knowledge with others. Mark figures if it helped him then it may be able to help others. This is how The Quilting Marine was started. It is Mark's mission to help as many people as possible find this amazing craft which may lead to healing for them as well.

Class 100: Contemporary Samples Trunk Show



Are you thinking about investing in a longarm quilting machine? Do you know where to start and what questions to ask? Join Chelce as she goes over areas to consider when making decisions regarding the many options you have. Not only brand specifics but also table(frame) size, throat space, stitch regulator, robotics, maintenance, and of course the almighty dollar. You will create your own list of personal top 5 'most important things to consider' as you research, drive machines, then decide, "To invest, or not to invest... that is the question."

Class 103: Longarm/Domestic Quilt **Technique Class**

Whether you quilt with a domestic or longarm machine, this drawing class is intended to give you more tools in your toolbox when it comes to quilting ideas. What do I quilt in a border,

sashing, or block? How about an overall design? Clem will teach ways to break down a design to make it simple and build your confidence when tackling those terrifying words "guilt as desired." The first half of the class will be drawing with the second half discussing ways to quilt a top. Feel free to bring one quilt top to discuss. We will design as many tops as time allows. Drawing handouts will be available.



Class 104: Mystery Quilt



Thurs. - Full Day 1:00-4:00 PM, 6:00-9:00 PM All Levels - Andrew Lee National Teacher \$75

In this class you will be creating a quilt that will be sure to please the eye and will be easy to piece. Participants will be given fabric requirements and some initial fabric sub cutting directions to prepare for the class. Fabric and Color choices are totally up to you. Two different sized quilts can also be made. That choice is yours as well. The final block cutting will be done using the Accuquilt die system. Participants should be able to complete 16 blocks during

the class time. Maybe you want to turn those blocks into a Quilts of

Valor Quilt?

Class 105: Crumb Piecing Quilt



Thurs. - Full Day 1:00-4:00 PM, 6:00-9:00 PM All Levels - Mark Darrell National Teacher \$75

Most quilters can't bear to part with scraps of favorite fabrics and tend to keep them stored for future use. Those scraps after all have been bought and paid for already and are often a reminder of previous quilts that were made.

Crumb quilting, although not a new idea, is enjoying a resurgence now as we try to use up all those bits of fabric we've been saving. Basically, it's sewing small pieces of fabric together to make new fabric which can be cut up to make blocks, borders, sashing and more. My motto is if the scrap fits under the presser foot it is usable for crumb piecing. You decide if you want super scrappy or a more controlled look by what scraps you use to build the fabric blocks.

Class 106: Machine Quilting with a **Walking Foot**

Do you love the look of machine quilting, but don't feel comfortable doing the guilting yourself? It is possible to do some simple, but

beautiful quilting, using your domestic machine. Come learn how to do your own beginning quilting, and do a great job of it!(No free motion involved!) Examples of walking foot quilting will be presented. Handouts will be available. \$5 handout fee

Class 107: Free Motion Quilting on Your **Domestic Machine**

Free motion quilting on a domestic machine will give you many tips and suggestions. There will be samples to view, and you will have time

to practice advancing your skills with the tips you have picked up. Students need their sewing machine with an extension table and a Supreme Slider, if available. Handout fee \$5.

Class 108: Wool Appliqué Tartcup Pincushion

If you love to work with wool and are looking for a cute and easy to make project, this is the class for you. In this class you will be making a pin cushion using wool. The pincushion will be embellished with beads and decorative stitches using floss. Class kit fee payable to the teacher \$20

Class 109: Sew Much Fun with Featherweights

Calling all Featherweight owners! This class will help you to design a quilted mat and dust cover for your treasured featherweight. To personalize your creation you will be given an opportunity to increase your knowledge of featherweight attachments. Class kit fee of \$45 payable to the teacher.

Class 110: Featherweights 101

You will learn the basics of how to clean and lubricate your featherweight machine. Then you will be given a chance to use your machine for a small project that will be completed during the class. WARNING: You may gain a new appreciation for the beauty

of what these small machines can provide in stitch quality and ease of operation.

Class 111: Fabric Bowl-No Rope

This hands on fabric bowl making class that does NOT

involve rope. These decorative bowls are layered together like a quilt and finished on the edge with a binding or similar material. Fabric bowls are a great alternative to ceramic or pottery and can be used to display items throughout a home. Required class kit fee payable to the teacher \$10. Optional Fabric kit also available from the teacher \$12

Class 112: Interleave Mini



Thurs. - Full Day 1:00-4:00 PM, 6:00-9:00 PM All Levels - Lynette Mart \$60

Create your own design and quilt as you go. The Interleave quilt is made from pieced fabric panels that are cut into strips and then are sewn back together to create a wavy pattern.

Class 113: Speedwell Sling Bag



Thurs. - Full Day 1:00-4:00 PM, 6:00-9:00 PM Intermediate - Sharon Henry \$60

This is a perfect unisex bag. There are 4 zippers and a few pockets. Plenty of spots to store everything. It has one front zippered flap pocket with 2 zippers on each side and closes at the top with your choice of a small thumb lock, turn lock or magnetic snap. When the flap is fully open, the contents will remain inside the

front pocket thanks to the gussets on both sides. In the bag's interior, there are 2 slip pockets. The strap is adjustable and can be installed to carry the bag either over the shoulder, back or front. Great for a person on the go! The Speedwell Sling Bag is an Intermediate sewing pattern.

followed by pencil and paper activities. No sewing, no extensive supply list, and no UFO!

Class 203: Sun Printing




Fri. 4:00-5:00 PM Lecture - Connie Busch \$15

In this class you will learn the process I use for dyeing and printing on fabric with the help of the Sun. The power of the Sun, natural fiber fabrics, sun-sensitive fabric, paints/

dyes, and everyday objects are used to create beautiful patterns with nearly endless combinations of colors and designs. You will learn the process and supplies needed to create one of a kind fabrics. You will also learn how to make the newly printed fabrics ready for use in many ways in your quilting, sewing, crafting and art projects. This is a very easy to learn technique that I find very addictive. The supply costs are very reasonable to get started. I can't wait to teach you how to use this technique too! Samples of my Sun printed fabrics will be shown as well as some projects I created using the fabrics.

Class 204: Tips, Tricks, Bindings and Borders

Tips, Tricks, Bindings and Borders is a class where you learn the Why to all the things you were taught. Some things have changed, and new tools and methods have been developed. In this class all those questions will be answered, with scientific proof.

Class 205: Leaf Quilt

This stunning Autumn Leaf quilt is a real show stopper! Let Andrew help you turn those amazing fall colored fabrics into a beautiful quilt. This is a Fat quarter friendly pattern. The

background and borders can be all one fabric or can be made more scrappy with several similar light fabrics, the choice is yours.

Class 206: Layouts, Designs and Color Placements

Fri. 6:30-8:00 PM \$20 All Levels - Mark Darrell National Teacher

In this class Mark will teach you how important contrast is in your quilting projects and how to best achieve it. Choosing quilt layouts is a fundamental part of the design process, whether you're just beginning or have been designing for a long time you know how challenging this process can be at times. Mark will give his ideas on block design and layout to make those decisions easier. He will talk about the color wheel and color theory. He will teach you about choosing your colors wisely to overall improve the look of your quilts. He will discuss what determines the mood or tone of a quilt. He will have a take home reference guide for you to use in your future projects.

Class 207: Kaleidoscope Quilt



Fri. - Full Day 8:00-11:00 AM, 1:00-4:00 PM All Levels - Mark Darrell National Teacher \$75

A Kaleidoscope Quilt is a quilt inspired by the symmetrical patterns found in a Kaleidoscope. The quilts made with this quilt block use color and placement for the effect. This technique for creating

a Kaleidoscope quilt is using the One Block Wonder style done with fabric repeats stacked on top of each other. Strip sets are cut from the stacked fabric, then will be cut into blocks using an angle ruler. Once the block is sewn, very beautiful and unique blocks are created. To make the quilt as the sample picture shows, the fabrics they are available to purchase directly from the teacher's website (www.thequiltingmarine.com). You may use your own fabrics as well.

Class 208: Sisterhood Quilt



Fri. 6:00-9:00 PM Confident Beginner Lynette Mart \$35

In this class Lynette will teach you an easy quilt pattern. This is a beginner friendly pattern for quilters who have already done some pieced quilt projects and would like to try a new pattern and further build their skills. You will be making a colorful lap quilt with black

accents out of half square triangles and strips. The pattern makes a 50" X 64" quilt and is a pattern from Villa Rosa Designs.



Class 209: Paper Pieced 3.5" Block

(Introduction to paper piecing)



Fri. 8:30-10:30 AM All Levels - Pat McDaniel \$20

In this class you will learn how to make easy paper pieced 3.5" blocks. If you have never tried paper piecing this is a great beginner class to try out the technique. A kit of fabrics and patterns will be provided for the class. If you desire you can continue on to part 2 of Pat's paper piecing class: Paper Pieced Barn Block where you will use the block you make in this class to learn more about the technique. Class kit fee \$10 payable to the teacher.

Class 210: Paper Pieced Barn Block

(must take class #209 first)



Fri. 12:45-4:45 PM All Levels - Pat McDaniel \$35

This is the second class of a 2 part class series that Pat is teaching using paper piecing. The paper pieced barn quilt block will explore advanced techniques of paper piecing. You will make a barn block that can be made into a pillow top,

wall hanging or center for a quilt. .As part of the class you will receive 2 sets of the pattern. One to use in the class and one set to use if you wish to make additional copies for blocks for a wall hanging or quilt. Class kit fee payable to the teacher \$25.

Class 211: Needle Turned Appliqué



Fri. 6:00-8:00 PM All Levels - Pat McDaniel \$20

In needle turned appliqué, the raw edges of the fabric shape are sewn under while you are hand stitching the shape to the background. If you have hand-sewn a binding to the back of a quilt, you have

already practiced making your stitches disappear, which is the skill needed for this appliqué method. This project will be a six inch turned appliqué block. This method leaves no exposed raw edges and does not use any type of fusible stabilizer. This is a great hand sewing project that can be taken with you and worked on almost anywhere with just a few supplies. Class kit fee payable to the teacher \$10.



Class 212: Crazy Quilt Piecing with Wool

Join Bonnie as she guides you through her simple technique for crazy quilt piecing with wool. You will make a 12" block, learn some basic stitches, and be given options for adding wool appliqués to your block.

Class 214: Exploding Heart

What makes your heart burst with Joy? Capture the feeling with the Exploding Heart by slice of π quilts! This advanced

beginner pattern makes a large 72" X 72" throw quilt. You can make this quilt in a three color scrappy combination or totally scrappy with many colors.

Class 215: Open Wide Diagonal Zipper Pouch



Fri. 8:00-11:00 AM Confident Beginner Connie Busch \$35

In this class you will be making a unique soft sided and quilted Zippered Pouch. When unzipped the pouch opens out

into a flat bottom type tray. This pouch could be perfect for storing your sewing tools & notions. It could be used for your child's school supplies or small toys. They also make great storage for makeup or toiletry supplies. There are so many possible uses you will want to make many more. The simple to sew pattern can be made in several sizes or designs depending on the type of fabric you chose. This is an easy project for a Confident beginner or Intermediate Quilter looking to use quilting in something other than just a quilt. The pattern will be provided by the teacher.

Class 216: Feather Flurry

Let's learn how to appliqué this cute 18" x 35.5" wall hanging. Time to get out of your box and learn something new! The pattern is called Feather Flurry. Class 217: Easiest Ever T-shirt Quilt



Fri. 10:00 -11:00 AM **Lecture - Lynette Mart**

This is an easy and quick method to make T-Shirt guilts. You will learn from Lynette the how to's and other tips in her design layout and construction. It is a fast method without a lot of fussy steps. She will teach you how to use 1" fusible grid and sew it together

"Mondo Bag" style and bind it with magic binding. This class will be part lecture, demo, and slide show of quilts she has made for clients.

Class 218: Wool Appliqué Needle Case



Fri. - Full Day 1:00-4:00 PM, 6:00-9:00 PM All Levels - Carla Fettig \$60

As "makers" we have numerous needles for different purposes. Sometimes locating the needle for the job is a challenge - which

You may choose to follow the pattern suggestions for colors or you may choose your own combination such as reds, whites & blues for a Patriotic look. The larger size meets Quilts of Valor size requirements.

Class 305: Raw Edge Appliqué (Mystery Quilt)



Sat. - Full Day 8:00 AM-11:00 AM, 1:00-4:00 PM All Levels - Mark Darrell National Teacher \$75

Appliqué adds complementary texture, color and designs to your quilts. In this class Mark will be teaching his Raw Edge Appliqué technique to embellish and enhance a quilt or wall hanging. For the class you will bring your own pieced quilt top or wall hanging, cheater fabric or solid whole cloth to put the appliqué onto. He will teach you how to transfer your appliqué design to your fabric and then how to attach it to your project. You will get to pick from two different appliqué patterns he has created. The actual appliqué designs will be kept a secret and revealed exclusively for the first time at the class. How fun is that! All designs are solid black appliqué. To find out the rest you will have to take the class.

how easy it is to make tiny Flying Geese). 'Purr'sistence Quilt Pattern is available from Deb's Cats N Quilts online at debscatsnquilts.com. The pattern is called 'Purr'sistence and the cost is \$10.00 plus \$3.50 for shipping or you can buy the digital copy.

Class 310: Blue Moon Table Runner



Sat. - Full Day 8:00 AM-11:00 AM, 1:00-4:00 PM Confident Beginner Lauren Rogers \$60

Brad and Judy Niemeyer designed the layout, instructions, and foundation papers for the Blue Moon Placemats. A sewing technique called foundation paper piecing is used to assemble the units required to

make this project. Curved piecing is used to join the units after the foundation piecing is completed. This pattern can be purchased online at www.quiltworx.com/blue-moon-placemats-special/. In this class you will be constructing a table runner using this paper piecing technique. The pattern is designed to teach you the basics of this technique.

CHALLENGE QUILT RULES Patriotic Fidget Quilt

Challenge quilt must include

- 1. Button
- 2. Crunchy item
- 3. Elastic
- 4. Patriotic fabric
- 5. Pocket
- 6. Ribbon
- 7. Roll-up for portability
- 8. Velcro
- 9. Zipper
- Quilting: must have three layers consisting of top, batting, and backing. Must be quilted.
- 11. No ties or false backs.
- 12. Safety: all features must be safe for disabled children and elderly adults.
- 13. Size: starting at 108" perimeter up to 168" perimeter (22"x32" up to 36"x48")
- 14. Techniques: you may use any technique for the quilt top.
- 15. Washable: must be machine washable.



QUILT SHOW ENTRY GUIDELINES

- An entry form must be submitted for each item entered. You may enter as many categories as you wish; however only one entry is allowed per category. An entry fee of \$7.00 for guild members and \$10.00 non-members, needs to accompany EACH quilt submission and entry form. There is no entry fee for the "youth" category. Be sure to complete one entry form and pay \$7.00 or \$10.00 for each quilt entered.
- Entry forms must be received by March 21, 2024.

- 3. Items entered in the judged categories must be made of fabric and consist of three layers held together by quilting, with the exception of the Wool on Wool, Category 11 (see definition under entry categories). Item must be in excellent condition, free of odors and pet hair. Tied, soiled, or torn quilted items and hard-framed quilts will not be accepted. No false backings will be accepted as the judge must be able to see quilting from the back of the quilt. Item must have been constructed by the exhibitor and must not have previously been entered in the Minot Prairie Quilt Show. All quilts must be labeled with the "quilt identification tag". All quilts must be left on display until the show closes.

- 4. Special techniques include appliqué, embroidery, crazy patch, stained glass, fused, fringed, photo transfers, painting, etc.
- 5. The Festival Committee reserves the right to place entries in more appropriate categories. The judge may award duplicate ribbons in any category and reserves the right not to award ribbons if specific category criteria have not been met. All judged entries will receive a written evaluation.
- 6. The Minot Prairie Quilt Guild and the Grand Hotel will not be responsible for damages, loss, or theft of any article during the Quilt Show. During show hours, guild members will patrol the display area. After hours the show room is locked, and security will be provided.
- 7. Entries are to be brought to the Grand Hotel in Minot, ND located at 1505 N Broadway Minot, ND 58703 (Located on Top of Minot's North Hill) on **Tuesday,** April 2, 2024, between 11:00 AM and 3:00 PM. Entries will not be accepted on Wednesday, April 3, 2024.
- 8. If you are unable to hand deliver your quilts, you may ship your entries to Corrina Lemer (address in #2).
 Please include a complete return shipping label and return postage. All entries will be returned as requested by the quilter.
- 9. Quilt Show entries will be released for pick-up at **11:00 AM on Sunday, April 7, 2024**, and must be picked up no later than 12:30 PM.

QUILT SHOW ENTRY CATEGORIES

CLASS 1: Handwork

Includes appliqué piecing or quilting that is predominantly hand work, any size, any technique. (Less than 325" perimeter)

CLASS 2: Bed Quilts

Intended for use on twin or larger bed. (Less than 325" perimeter)

- 2A Machine quilted. Quilts entered in this category have been completed on a home machine, midarm, or longarm by someone who does not do quilting for hire. Pieced and quilted by one person.
- 2B Professionally quilted edge to edge utilizing pantograph and/or computer quilting programs. If the item contains ANY professional custom quilting must be entered in CLASS 6A or 6B.

CLASS 3: Throw/Lap/Crib Quilt

Intended for use as such. (Less than 300" perimeter)

- 3A Machine quilted. Quilts entered in this category have been completed on a home machine, midarm, or longarm by someone who does not do quilting for hire. Pieced and quilted by one person.
- 3B Professionally quilted edge to edge utilizing pantograph and/or computer quilting programs. Any item containing ANY professional custom quilting must be entered in CLASS 6A or 6B.

CLASS 4: Large Wall Hanging

Intended for use on a wall. (Larger than 161" in perimeter). Any quilting technique.

- 4A Machine quilted. Quilts entered in this category have been completed on a home machine, midarm, or longarm by someone who does not do quilting for hire. Pieced and quilted by one person.
- 4B Professionally quilted edge to edge utilizing pantograph and/or computer quilting programs.

CLASS 5: Small Wall Hanging

Intended for use on a wall. (160" in perimeter or less) Any quilting technique.

- 5A Machine quilted. Quilts entered in this category have been completed on a home machine, midarm, or longarm by someone who does not do quilting for hire. Pieced and quilted by one person.
- 5B Professionally quilted edge to edge utilizing pantograph and/or computer quilting programs.

CLASS 6: Professionally Custom Quilted

- 6A The quilts in this category have been custom-quilted by a professional quilter. If anything is custom quilted, it belongs in this category. (Less than 240" in perimeter).
- 6B The quilts in this category have been customquilted by a professional quilter. If anything is custom quilted, it belongs in this category. (241" to 325" in perimeter)

CLASS 7: Holiday Theme

Any item or quilting method. The item must include some quilting. (Less than 325" perimeter)

CLASS 8: Household

Includes table runners, placemats, pillows, kitchen or sewing room accessories, purses/totes, etc. The item must include some quilting.

CLASS 9: Challenge Quilt

See Instructions on Page 18. (108" to 168" perimeter)

CLASS 10: Youth

Made by a person 17 years of age or younger at the time of the entry date. Quilts will be critiqued but not judged. No entry fee is required; however, prize money will be awarded to each entrant. (Less than 325" perimeter)

CLASS 11: Wool on Wool

Two layers of wool (no batting or quilting). Items may include penny rugs, table runners/toppers, and candle mats.

Class 12: Miniatures

Reflects reduced size and miniaturization: any techniques. Blocks must be 4 inches or less. Maximum of 24 inches per side.

CLASS 13: Special Techniques

Entries in this category include machine appliqué, whole cloth, crazy patch, cathedral window, trapunto quilting, photo transfer, and nontraditional or mixed techniques. (Less than 325" perimeter)

CLASS 14: Group

Quilts are made by two or more individuals. (Less than 325" perimeter)

NOTES: False backs are not allowed except for the Wool-on-Wool category. The judge must be able to see the quilting from the back.

The Art, Miniature, and Modern categories will be included on a rotational basis. Miniatures in 2024, Modern Quilts in 2025, and Art Quilts in 2026.
