The library will be open at 6 pm at the February guild meeting. Come check it out if you are looking for inspiration for a new project for the new year. See you then.




A Dandy

** Preparing the Pieces **




Mark and cut the Color 1 2-1/2" x 20" strip into eight 2-1/2" squares...



Then, mark and cut the Color 2 2-1/2" x 18" strip into four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles...



Next, mark and cut the Color 3 2-1/2" x 18" strip into four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"rectangles...




Now speed piece the half squares by stacking the Color 3 and Color 1 4-7/8" \times 9-3/4" strips, right sides together, marking the 4-7/8" square lines, marking the diagonals in the directions shown at left, and then sewing 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals, pivoting at the 4-7/8" square lines. Cut apart ON the marked diagonals, and cut apart on the square lines as well. This will give you four half squares....now...


** Let's Get to the Sewing **




Place a Color 1 small square right sides together aligned with the left end of a Color 2 rectangle. Mark the diagonal on the back of the red square, and sew ON this marked line. Cut off excess seam allowance and press the remainder towards the corner triangle. Sew another red square on the other end using the same method. Make four of these...on to Page 2



Sew each of the units we just made to a Color 3 rectangle along the bottom edge, using a 1/4" seam, pressing seam allowance towards the darker fabric. Make four of these...




Piece the block by first sewing rows, and then sewing the rows together, being sure to alternate pressing directions!



Here you see a sample quilt with block-to-block construction...

...on to Page 3



...or here, with about 2" sashing strips sewn between the blocks... Whatever You chose...it's a wonderfully simple but attractive block! :o)

Color 2 needs: one strip 2-1/2" x 18"



Color 3 needs: one strip 2-1/2" x 18" AND one strip 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" AND one 4-1/2" square

Hospitality

Pam Abrahamson asked for volunteers. 7 members volunteered to provide snacks in February.

Festival

Updates reported by Jackie Slagle included:

- Reminded everyone to book a hotel room by calling hotel directly. She stated the block of rooms is filling fast, so book early.
- Members are reminded to register by January 15th to have a better chance at a spot in classes of their choice. Registration opens to the public after that date.

- T-shirt orders will be taken until January 15th. Lynn was taking orders at meeting. If you want a T-Shirt after the meeting contact Jackie or Lynn.
- Volunteer signup started at the meeting. Sheilla Anderson is the volunteer chair. Please reach out to her to volunteer.
- Jackie explained the Basket drawings we will have at Festival. Carla Preston would like those who have volunteered to provide a basket to contact her, so she can update her list.
- Jackie spoke on the need for a Festival chair for 2024 and stated this could be our last Festival unless we have a chair for next year. The agreement with the hotel needs to be signed to book the hotel and we need a chair to sign the agreement.
- Vendor Chair, Pam Kolschefski, asked anyone who is traveling in the State to take 'Save the Date cards" or catalogs to shops if able. Also, some vendors may have items for the registration packets, and these could be picked up and returned to us to save the vendor postage.

Block of the Month

Jackie explained the Block of the Month. We will have 12 blocks, some months you will need to complete two blocks to have a completed quilt by the end of the year. This month's block was the Dutchman's Puzzle (also called the Spinning Pinwheel). Jackie asked all those who completed blocks to have a group picture. Jackie explained you have your name put in a drawing for completing a block and an additional drawing for each additional block you bring in. Celeste Hauser won the drawing for the January block; Irva Undlin won the drawing for having additional blocks.

Minot Prairie Quilt Guild Board Meeting Vincent United Methodist Church January 19, 2023

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by President Sue Brown

Board members in attendance were Sue Brown, Celeste Hauser, Sheila Latham, Sharleen Larson, Lynn Heald, Linda Hoff, Corrina Lemer, Jackie Slagle, Debbie Brothers, and Lisa Krebsbach. There were ten members present, thus meeting the requirement for a quorum.

Standing Committee members present: Debra Forsberg, Stacy Walz, Carla Preston, Luanne Duchsherer and Pam Abrahamson.

Secretary's Minutes

President Sue Brown asked if there were any additional corrections or additions to the November 17, 2022, Board meeting minutes as printed in the December 2022 newsletter. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Jackie Slagle and seconded by Celeste Hauser. Voice vote carried.

Treasurer's Report

Lynn Heald reported the amounts of income, expenses, and final balances of Guild accounts. Lynn reported the annual

audit had been completed on January 14, 2023, by Deb Ledoux and Marie Kakela. The balance given was the approved audited balance for 2022. The audit committee commented they found some purchases where the purchaser could have found a less expensive item. The committee felt in some instances we need to be more frugal.

There was discussion on having the Board approve all payments before the Treasurer pays the bill. A motion was made by Jackie Slagle and seconded by Sharleen Larson that all bills be presented to the Board prior to payment. Voice vote carried.

Lynn noted it states in the job descriptions that individuals are not to go over budget. She reminded all chairs to watch their budgets carefully. Lynn stated she does let individuals know if they are getting close to going over budget.

The Board discussed the 2023 budget as presented by the Treasurer. Recommendations were made for a few changes. A motion was made by Sheila Latham and seconded by Linda Hoff to change the payouts for Viewer's Choice awards for the annual Challenge Quilt to \$35 for first place, \$25 for second place and \$15 for third place and to have these funds come from the Education budget. Voice vote carried. A motion was made by Sheila Latham and seconded by Sharleen Larson to give Vincent United a donation of \$1,500 for 2023 for the use of the building. Voice vote carried. Lynn will incorporate these and other changes into the document and present the final budget at the next Board meeting.

Unfinished Business

Sheila Latham reported the quilt clips have been returned, however, three clips were damaged. The hold check given was deposited to cover the damages. The clips are currently being kept by Sheila until the Festival.

Community Service

There was discussion regarding the need for the deposit check for using the Accuquilt. There is a form the member must sign already which states they will pay for any damages. A motion was made by Sharleen Larson and seconded by Corrina Lemer to no longer require a deposit check from members for use of the Accuquilt or Dies and to have the time for checking out the machine be one week. Voice vote carried.

Education

Jackie Slagle reported we will have the second block from the Block of the Month due at the February meeting. Members can still show her block 1. She reported that Chelce Detert from Creative Dimensions will be presenting at the February meeting and will be bringing some items from her shop to sell. Jackie asked if we would like a Flea Market in June, it was suggested she ask the members at the next guild meeting if they would like to have a Flea Market.

Festival 2023

Jackie Slagle reported that registrations are now open and complemented Stacy Walz for the wonderful job she has been doing of promoting the classes on Facebook in such a professional manner.

Historian

Alexis was unable to attend the meeting. However, Luanne had the 2022 Minot Prairie Quilt Guild book. There was discussion on how to have these more accessible to members. It was decided that several of the more recent years would be kept in the library shelves and made available at meetings for members to view.

Hospitality

Lisa Krebsbach will be putting the duties of the hostesses in the newsletter to remind members of our responsibilities when we are the hostesses.

Library

Debbie reported she had ordered books from Martingale for \$65.70. This purchase would be above the budget. A motion was made by Jackie Slagle and seconded by Lisa Krebsbach to approve this purchase. Voice vote carried.

Membership

Linda Hoff reported we currently have 114 members. It was decided that Linda can purchase 200 flyers given to new members. She will determine best place to make purchase.

Facebook

It was reported there were individuals on the members only Facebook who are not current members or have never been members. It was decided that we would use the same guidelines as the newsletter for removing individuals from the members only page. These guidelines are that you must be a member by April, or you no longer receive the newsletter.

Newsletter

Reminder that the deadline for the newsletter is Sunday, January 22nd.

Debra Forsberg reported that the current quilt stand is broken. She stated the company which made these stands is no longer in business. It was discussed we made need to find a replacement on how we display the raffle quilt.

Quilt Challenge Rules

Challenge quilt must include

- 1. Prairie Points
- 2. Flying Geese
- 3. Applique
- 4. Minimum of 3 items that represent the ND prairie. This may be applique, pieced, or embellished.

Perimeter must not be larger than 200 inches. It must have 3 layers consisting of top, batting, and backing. No false backs allowed

*An additional category will allow a wool on wool option with all of the requirements for top as listed above, but finished as a wool on wool entry with no batting or quilting.
