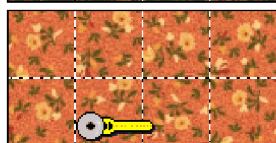

## **\*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\***



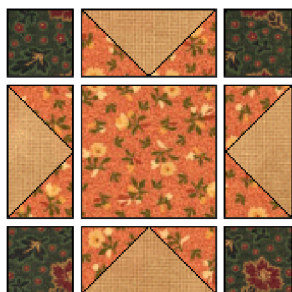
Cut the Color 2 3-1/2" x 14" strip into four 3-1/2" squares, and the Color 1 7" x 14" strip into eight 3-1/2" squares...



Next cut the Color 3 3-1/2" x 26" strip into four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles...



To make one flying geese unit, place a Color 1 square right sides together atop a Color 3 rectangle, with outer edges aligned. On the back of the top square lightly mark the diagonal. Sew on this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the corner. Repeat this with another Color 1 square on the other end of the rectangle. Make four of these...



Now lay out all units as shown at left. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing the top and bottom row seams to the center, and the middle row seam to the outside. Sew the rows together and there is your Austin block!...on to Page 2!

Color 1 Color 1 needs: one 6-1/2" square AND one 7" x 14" strip



Color 2 Color 2 needs: one 3-1/2" x 14" strip



Color 3 Color 3 needs: one 3-1/2" x 26" strip

### **Cutting Instructions for 6-1/2" Block**

Color 1: Cut (1) 3-1/2" block & (8) 2" blocks

Color 2: Cut (4) 2x3-1/2" blocks

Color 3: Cut (4) 2" blocks

**Sew Saturdays**

All members are invited to come and sew 'just for fun' on Saturday, February 18th from 9am to 5pm at Vincent United. Sue shared a tidbit she learned; Menards is a good place to purchase Best Press. Community Service will have quilts ready to quilt on your domestic machine if you would like to on this Saturday.

**Festival**

Updates reported included:

- Sheilla Anderson asked everyone to remember to sign up to volunteer when you aren't taking a class. She stated she really needs volunteers for Wednesday and Thursday and during meal- times.
- Jackie Slagle thanked all the volunteers and reminded us how critical everyone is in making the Festival successful. She stated this year's Festival has a focus on young and newer quilters. She stated this is not determined by age, but by how long you have been quilting.
- Sheila Latham gave the current class status. Class 305- Saturday, Featherweight Maintenance is currently full. The lectures are all getting close to filling. Sheila reminded everyone next meeting is the deadline for meal ticket purchases.
- Judi Green stated she only has 11 quilt entries so far. Next meeting is the deadline to enter your quilts. She reminded us; we cannot have a quilt show without quilts.
- Lynn Heald handed out a survey on Festival and asked everyone to fill it out and turn into her at the end of the meeting. These surveys will help the Board determine the future of the Festival.

## **Community Service**

**Secretary's Minutes**

President Sue Brown asked if there were any additional corrections or additions to the January 19, 2023, Board meeting minutes as printed in the January 2023 newsletter. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Jackie Slagle and seconded by Linda Hoff. Voice vote carried.

**Treasurer's Report**

Lynn Heald reported the amounts of income, expenses, and current balances of Guild accounts. Lynn gave a report of the expenses to be approved and paid. Lynn reported there was an anonymous donation of \$500 to be used at Creative Dimensions for members to quilt community service quilts. Lynn reported new quilt racks have been purchased to replace the one which had broken. A motion was made by Corrina Lemer and seconded by Celeste Hauser to accept the report pending annual audit for 2023. Voice vote carried.

The Board discussed the revisions made as recommended from the last meeting to the 2023 budget as presented by the Treasurer. There was a recommendation to increase the Education budget by \$200, due to the fact this budget contains Education, Block of the Month, and the Viewer's Choice payouts for the Festival Challenge Quilts. A motion was made by Corrina Lemer and seconded by Linda Hoff to increase the Education budget by \$200. Voice vote carried. A motion was made by Sharleen Larson and seconded by Jackie Slagle to approve the 2023 budget as presented with the change as approved in the prior motion. Voice vote carried.

Sharleen reported there was a donation made by someone who called the guild with boxes of fabric. Sharleen and Judi went the persons home and went through the items and accepted some of the items. Sharleen stated some of cuts were large enough for quilt backings, there were some nice fabrics in the donation.

These books will be kept in the library and made available at meetings for members to view. Viewer's Choice for the 2023 Challenge Quilt will also be voted on by members present.

Jackie Slagle reported the block rate for the rooms at the Clarion are available until March 2nd. She asked anyone with issues with the rate to contact her and she will contact the hotel.

**Festival 2024**

Bev Cushing announced she is willing to Chair the 2024 Festival if there is enough support. Mary Kohler is willing to be her Co-Chair. Bev compiled the results of the survey handed out at the February guild meeting and gave a sheet to all board members. 40 people stated they wanted a Festival. 9 stated they did not want a Festival, 2 did not vote. 7 people stated they would be willing to step into a leadership role. Other survey results were briefly discussed.

### Quilt Challenge Rules

Challenge quilt must include

1. Prairie Points
2. Flying Geese
3. Applique
4. Minimum of 3 items that represent the ND prairie. This may be applique, pieced, or embellished.

Perimeter must not be larger than 200 inches. It must have 3 layers consisting of top, batting, and backing. No false backs allowed

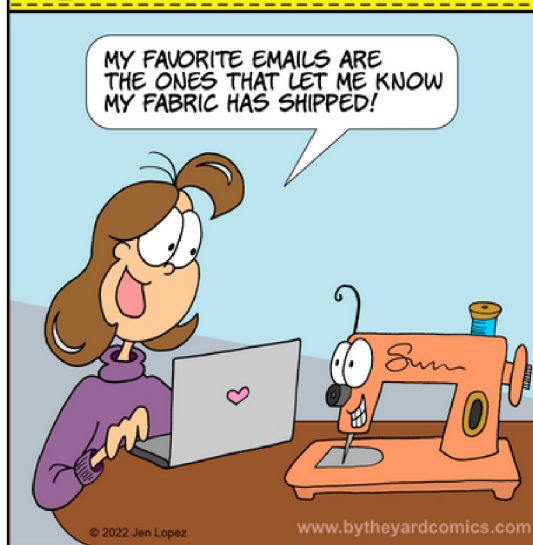
*\*An additional category will allow a wool on wool option with all of the requirements for top as listed above, but finished as a wool on wool entry with no batting or quilting.*
