



** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



Start by marking and cutting the Color 1 and Color 2 2-1/2" x 10" strips into four 2-1/2" squares of each...



Next mark and cut the Color 1, 2 and 3 2-1/2" x 18" strips into four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles of each...




Sew the Color 1 and Color 2 squares right sides together in pairs, using a scant 1/4" seam. Press seam to darker side. You will be making four units like this...






Sew the Color 2 rectangles to the side of the square pairs...two on the left, two on the right, with the Color 1 square on the bottom in each case. Press seam towards rectangle. These will be the block's four corner units...



Sew the Color 1 and Color 3 rectangles right sides together in pairs along one long edge, again using a scant 1/4" seam. Press seam to darker side. Make four units like this for the block's sides...



Now piece the block! Lay out all your units as shown at left, then sew three horizontal rows. Press top and bottom row seams towards the outsides, and center row seam towards the middle. ...and then join the rows!

** Supplies List **




This makes a 6" block!

Four blocks are shown together at right!




** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



Start by cutting one 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" strip of each color into two 3-7/8" squares each. Then stack and cut them on the diagonal with a rotary cutter...




Next cut the large squares of each color on the diagonal...




Then speed piece the remaining 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" strip of each color, by stacking them right sides together with all edges aligned. Mark the 3-7/8" square line, mark the diagonals in the direction shown as well, then sew 1/4" above and below the diagonal markings, pivoting at the 3-7/8" square line. Cut apart ON the marked diagonal, and cut apart on the square line also. This will give you four half squares. Trim to measure 3-1/2" if needed...



Sew a Color 1 small triangle to one side of a half square, referring to diagram for placement, using a scant 1/4" seam, and pressing seam allowances towards square. Sew another Color 1 small triangle to the adjacent side as shown, pressing seam allowance towards triangle. Make two of these units. Then make two more with the colors reversed.



Next sew a large Color 2 triangle to the unit shown above, pressing seam allowance towards the Color 2 triangle. Make two of these. Sew a Color 1 large triangle to each of the two reverse color units you made. This is one Birds in the Air block!



Sew four blocks together to make a 12" grouping! Simple!! :0)



Here's an idea of what your quilt would look like! I have also seen this one done as a patchwork quilt, and a wonderful light and dark pattern emerges that way. To do one as a patchwork, just remember to have light fabrics pointing in SW to NE and dark fabrics pointing in SE to NW...

Have fun with this one!! :0)



Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by President Sue Brown

Board members in attendance were Sue Brown, Celeste Hauser, Lynn Heald, Sheila Latham, Sharleen Larson, Linda Hoff, Corrina Lemer, Jackie Slagle, Debbie Brothers, Luanne Duchsherer, Bev Cushing, and Mary Kohler on video. There were twelve members present, thus meeting the requirement for a quorum.

Non-voting members (co-chairs) present: Carla Preston, Michelle Myers, Kim Block Others present: Pam Kolschefski

Secretary's Minutes

President Sue Brown asked if there were any additional corrections or additions to the March 13, 2023, Board meeting minutes as printed in the April 2023 newsletter. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Linda Hoff and seconded by Luanne Duchsherer. Voice vote carried.

Treasurer's Report

Lynn Heald reported the amounts of income, expenses, and current balances of Guild accounts. Lynn gave a report of the expenses to be approved and paid. A motion was made by Celeste Hauser and seconded by Linda Hoff to accept the report pending annual audit for 2023. Voice vote carried.

Unfinished Business

The Board discussed the need for an additional storage unit. After discussion it was felt there is not a need at this time for an additional storage unit.

Community Service

Sharleen reported there are kits being organized and the committee plans to meet at Saturday Sewing, April 22 to continue to assemble kits. She reported 14 quilts have been completed by volunteers.

Education

Jackie Slagle reported we will continue with Block of the Month. Members can find the directions for the blocks on our Member's Only Facebook page in the file section. Jackie reported we will have the Flea Market after the May meeting. Members are asked to use their flea market numbers, if they don't have one, they can reach out to Jackie to obtain a number. Members will need to set up by 6:30 on the tables set up for the flea market. Sales will be after the May meeting.

Jackie reported she is working on a September education opportunity with Carla Fettig. The dates she is working on are September 15th and 16th. It will be Friday evening and Saturday. This will be the class she taught at Festival – Custom prints from Solids. The amount being charged will depend on the number of members wanting to take the class and will need to cover the costs of having the class. A motion was made by Lynn Heald to pursue a Fall Education opportunity on September 15th and 16th with Carla Fettig. The motion was seconded by Celeste Hauser. After discussion voice vote carried.

Festival 2023

Jackie Slagle reported the evaluation comments regarding the Clarion were sent to the hotel. There were several pages of them. An email was also sent regarding the Pasta meal. A meeting was held with the Clarion on April 20th, with the owner, manager, Jackie Slagle, Lynn Heald and Bev Cushing. The owner was very rude. He stated our bill was past due, however, a bill was never sent to Lynn to pay. The Clarion stated they do not want to rent their space to the guild in the future. Jackie stated she will be sending an email to the CVB in regard to our experience with the Clarion.

Festival 2024

Bev Cushing has been looking at potential spaces for the 2024 Festival. She has gone to the Auditorium, Grand and MSU. So far, these venues are not looking as possibilities for 2024. After the Clarion meeting, Bev, Jackie and Lynn went over to the Fair Grounds. There results will be discussed with the Festival Board. She will report back once a decision has been made on the venue and date.

Historian

Coffee, Tea, and Quilting Retreat

Come join us for a relaxing few days at the end of summer to unwind with friends at the Minot Prairie Quilt Guild retreat. Once again it will be held at Metigoshe Ministries just north of Bottineau, ND on beautiful lake Metigoshe. This year we are celebrating the friendships we develop over **Coffee, Tea, and Quilting**. The retreat officially starts on Friday, August 18th at 1:00 PM and ends at 3:00 PM on Sunday, August 20th. Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. The fee is \$140 for overnight quilters in themed rooms (bedding and towels included) and \$100 for daytime quilters.

Meals included are Friday dinner, Saturday lunch and dinner, and Sunday brunch. Continental breakfast will be served to all overnight guests. Bringing a snack to share is encouraged but not mandatory.

Nametags, cutting tables, and ironing stations will be furnished. A flea market will be available Friday and Saturday.

Payment: deposit of 50% is due at registration. Checks to be made out to MPQG and given to Jackie Case at the May 4th guild meeting or mailed to her address: 2405 14th St NW, Minot, ND 58703. Mailed registrations must be postmarked after May 4, 2023 or they will not be accepted. Balance is due by the August 3rd guild meeting.
