2024 Festival Challenge Quilt Rules

Theme: Patriotic Fidget Quilt

Must include:

- 1. Button
- 2. Crunchy item
- 3. Elastic
- 4. Patriotic fabric
- 5. Pocket
- 6. Ribbon
- 7. Roll-up for portability
- 8. Velcro
- 9. Zipper
- 10. Quilting: must have three layers consisting of top, batting, and backing. Must be quilted. No ties or false backs.
- 11. Safety: all features must be safe for disabled children and elderly adults.
- 12. Size: starting at 108" perimeter up to 168" perimeter (i.e., 22" x 32" up to 36" by 48")
- 13. Techniques: you may use any technique for the quilt top.
- 14. Washable: must be machine washable.

Meeting was called to order at 6:01 pm by President Sue Brown

Board members in attendance were Sue Brown, Celeste Hauser, Lynn Heald, Sheila Latham, Linda Hoff, Sharleen Larson, Jackie Slagle, Carla Preston, Corrina Lemer, Michelle Myers, Debbie Brothers, Bev Cushing, Mary Kohler and Pam Kolschefski. There were eleven voting members present, thus meeting the requirement for a quorum.

Sue reported the August mailed newsletters were returned to the post office box, due to needing a second stamp.

Secretary's Minutes

President Sue Brown asked if there were any additional corrections or additions to the June 15, 2023, Board meeting minutes as printed in the August 2023 newsletter. Motion to approve the minutes as printed was made by Sharleen Larson and seconded by Michelle Myers. Voice vote carried.

Treasurer's Report

Lynn Heald reported the amounts of income, expenses, and current balances of Guild accounts and several bills needing to be paid. A motion was made by Jackie Slagle and seconded by Mary Kohler to approve paying the bills and accept the report pending annual audit for 2023. Voice vote carried.

There was discussion on obtaining a Minot Prairie Quilt Banner to be used at various events. Lynn had designed several possibilities. She had done some research and the banner would cost approximately \$100. A motion was made by Jackie Slagle to approve the purchase of a Minot Prairie Quilt Guild Banner, the white background with black letters. The motion was seconded by Michelle Myers. Voice vote carried.

Unfinished Business

It was decided at a previous meeting we will no longer rent the Quilt Clips. There was discussion on whether we had reached out to let the other guilds who have used our clips know we are no longer going to lend them out. Sue stated she will reach out and let Bismarck Quilters know we no longer rent the clips. It was stated the Garrison guild had been informed.

Community Service No report.

Education

Jackie Slagle reported Bernina Plus will come to the September meeting and there will be a demonstration of the Martelli tables. It was reported the table will be set up prior to the meeting for showing the table. Jackie reported all the blocks for Block of the Month have been in the newsletters. She is working on having them all put on the

Facebook page. The class scheduled for September 15 – 16 currently has about 7 attending. If interested, please let Jackie know soon you would like to attend. Jackie stated we will have a Flea Market at the October meeting. She requested that if you will be selling items, please do not use tape, please use safety pins. For rulers or books, please use the tags with string and you can use tape on these times to tape the string to the items. This helps with checking out the items.


How to Become a Quilter
