Community Service

So far in 2023 the three Community Service committee members have worked more than 130 hours: Sorting, measuring, preparing fabric and batting, cutting backs and binding, delivering quilts, organizing totes, and moving to the new storage room location.

On Nov 4, the storage room was moved from the church's lower level to the main floor. Many Guild members helped as well as members from the Church. It is a smaller space but there are no steps to haul items up for Guild meetings and the availability of being able to work during the day will help immensely. With the Daycare located in same area, the only time available to access supplies was after 6 pm or weekends.

Our goal at the beginning of 2023 was to assure all completed quilt tops were kitted up with batting, backing, and binding; however, due to lack of workspace accessibility, we fell short of our goal. We were able to cut batting for tops on hand by working off site and went through over three rolls of batting.

Great efforts have been expended to decrease the amount of fabric and items in the storage room. All totes have been gone through and organized fabric by size and color. We received numerous donations of fabric that were also organized this way. Community Service was gifted \$500 from an anonymous donor that was used for quilting the quilts.

As of October 31, Community Service has gifted 42 quilts to the following organizations: Project Matthew 25, Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch, The Rehab and Recovery House, The Men's Shelter, and Trinity Cancer Center. We have 18 completed quilts to donate, hopefully in December. The total value of donated quilts so far this year is \$10,659.24.

2024 Festival Challenge Quilt Rules

Theme: Patriotic Fidget Quilt

Must include:

1. Button
2. Crunchy item
3. Elastic
4. Patriotic fabric
5. Pocket
6. Ribbon
7. Roll-up for portability
8. Velcro
9. Zipper
10. Quilting: must have three layers consisting of top, batting, and backing. Must be quilted. No ties or false backs.
11. Safety: all features must be safe for disabled children and elderly adults.
12. Size: starting at 108" perimeter up to 168" perimeter (i.e., 22" x 32" up to 36" by 48")
13. Techniques: you may use any technique for the quilt top.
14. Washable: must be machine washable.

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by President Sue Brown

Board members in attendance were Sue Brown, Celeste Hauser, Sheila Latham, Linda Hoff, Michelle Myers, Judi Green, Debbie Brothers, Corrina Lemer, and Bev Cushing. Non-voting members present were Lisa Krebsbach, Pam Abrahamson, Carla Preston, Janet Sabol, and Sharleen Larson. There were nine voting members present, thus meeting the requirement for a quorum.

Secretary's Minutes President Sue Brown asked if there were any corrections or additions to the October 19, 2023, Board meeting minutes as printed in the November 2023 newsletter. There being none a motion to approve the minutes as printed was made by Corrina Lemer and seconded by Judi Green. Voice vote carried.

Treasurer's Report Sue Brown received the reports from Lynn Heald and handed out the printed balance sheet, and the income and expense statements. Sue also reported on several bills needing to be paid. A motion was made by Michelle Myers and seconded by Judi Green to approve paying the bills and accept the reports pending annual audit for 2023. Voice vote carried.

Festival 2024 Bev reported Jana Frederick has volunteered to be the co-chair. The catalog has been sent to the printer. The Festival board will meet November 30th at Vincent to put the mailing labels and stamps on the catalogs. Sharleen asked a couple of questions. She asked about door prizes at classes. Bev stated there will not be door prizes in the classrooms, but every attendee will be given a ticket to put in for the basket bonanza. She stated there will be door prizes at the banquet. Sharleen also asked what was happening with the sewing machines which were purchased for the kid's classes. There will not be kid's classes at this Festival. The machines are being stored until we have classes for kids in the future.

Minot Prairie Quilt Guild – Honorary Member Guidelines

The description of an Honorary Member is one who has:

- been and continues to be an active member of the Guild for a minimum of 15 years.
- served on committees or has been a Guild Board member.
- made a significant contribution to the Guild/Festival activities.
- been a unifying, respected, positive contributor to the activities of the Guild.

Nomination Process:

- An announcement requesting nominations would be put in the December-January newsletters.
- The President will ask for any Honorary Member nominations from the Guild at the beginning of each year.
- Nominations can come from any Guild member.
- The nominator must complete the form.
- A nomination form is to be submitted to the President before the January Board meeting of the year the presentation is to be made.

Nomination Form shall include:

- Name, address, phone number, and email address of the nominee.
- Length of the nominee's guild membership.
- Participation in Guild/Festival activities: coordinating of special events, community service projects, member of Guild and/or Festival Boards, volunteering at Festival, etc.

Selection Process:

- Nomination forms are due to the President no later than the January Board meeting. The Membership Chair has these forms.
- The nominee(s) are reviewed at the February Board meeting and a ballot vote is taken.
- An Honorary Member does not have to be selected each year.
- The President will contact the selected Honorary Member to inform her/him that she/he will be recognized at the April Guild meeting.

Recognition:

- A short biography of the nominee will be compiled to present the newly chosen Honorary Member.
- Honorary Member will receive a plaque during a presentation at the April Guild meeting acknowledging their status in the Guild. The plaque will be ordered by the Guild's Membership Chair.
- An Honorary Member will have her/his Guild dues paid for the following year after being selected as an Honorary Member and receiving a plaque.
