


Quilting Sisterhood Quilt Challenge

Challenge Rules:



1. This paper pieced block must be in the quilt, at least once. The block can be in the quilt as many times as you want, or sections of the block can be in the quilt. As long as there is at least 1 full block in the quilt. Any additional blocks, or sections, may be applied, if you prefer.
2. You must use at least 4 fabrics that you received from someone else. The block sections may be made by different people, and exchanged, if you prefer.
3. There is no limit to the quilt size. It can be as large or small as you would like.
4. Your quilt must be 3 layers (top, batting, backing). It must be quilted and finished.
5. The finished quilt is due at the April 2026 general guild meeting. (April 2nd)





Block Construction: The pattern will make a 16 inch block.

1. Make 4 copies of the pattern. Then make 4 reversed copies. If your printer cannot print reversed, trace the pattern to the back side of a copy of the pattern and print 3 more of those. (The dress version and pants version are interchangeable)
2. **Just a note...** Each section will finish reversed from the pattern piece. You may need to take this into account when planning your layout...
3. Cut 1 copy of the pattern into an "A" section, a "B" section, and a "C" section (and a "D" section for the pants version)
4. For each section assemble the pieces (using paper piecing method) in the numbered order.
 - Piece A1, to A2, to A3, to A4
 - Piece B1, to B2, to B3
 - Piece C1, to C2, to C3, to C4, to C5, to C6
 - Sew the "A" section, to the "B" section, then to the "C" section (then to the "D" section for the pants version)
 - The head is applied onto the block. This can either be done now, or after the block is assembled.
 - 1/8th of your block is done!
5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 for the other 7 sections.
6. Sew the 8 sections together.
7. Remove the paper from the back.
8. All of the outer edges are probably on the bias. Adding a border at this point, or sewing a straight stitch 1/8th inch around the outer edge, will keep those bias edges from stretching.



Test Block 1st
